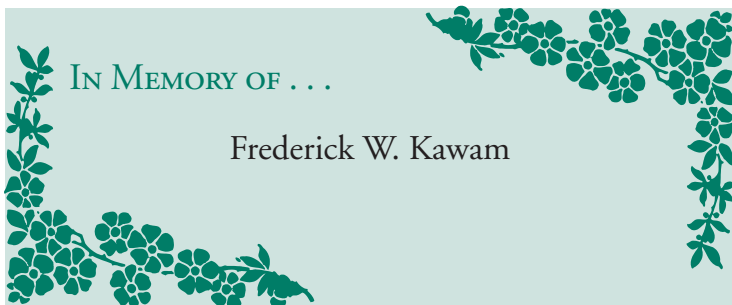

## ECOLOGY

**Adopt-A-Highway Program.** On June 23, the Ecology Committee sponsored a cleanup of Callawassie Drive from the Country Store to the security gate as part of the Adopt-A-Highway Program. The volunteers helping Dave D'Unger with this effort were Sandra D'Unger, Mary Filak, Glenn and Robin Hood, Phil and Phyllis Kilian, and Steve Tabor. Dave is looking for people willing to have their names on the list of potential volunteers for this program. A cleanup is done every 90 days or so, and 8-10 people are needed each time. **Red Fox.** Thanks for the many comments we received about recent red fox sightings on the island. It now appears that the fox population is actually increasing. In addition to red foxes, gray foxes were also sighted in the vicinity of Spring Island Drive and Woodstock Watch. If you see any animals that you think are unusual, the Ecology Committee would like to hear from you.

### Fall Schedule of Ecology Committee Sponsored Events

- On September 3, there will be dinner presentation on fish and fishing in the Lowcountry. Our guest speaker is Dave Harter who is a local water conservationist and fisherman extraordinaire.
- On October 8, we will be taking a boat trip in the vicinity of Hilton Head to observe and learn about dolphins. Look for an announcement with details about the trip in your mail tube in early September.
- On November 5, Bob Bender, the curator for the Low Country Estuarium in Port Royal, will be making a presentation on unfolding the mysteries of the Port Royal Estuary.
- In December, we will be conducting the Annual Audubon Bird Count, which will be preceded by a workshop on bird identification techniques conducted by Carlos Chacon from the Coastal Discovery Museum.

**Ecology Tip.** Even though summer is just about over, it can still be hot and our birds continue to need sources of clean fresh water to survive the heat and to prevent dehydration, just as we do. Clean out your bird baths monthly with a solution of vinegar and water to prevent algae and bacterial buildup. Use the stale water on your plants and replenish the bird bath with fresh water every 2 to 3 days.
